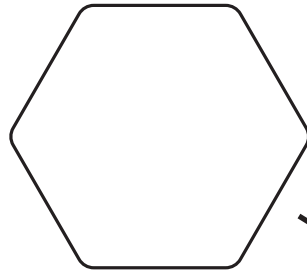


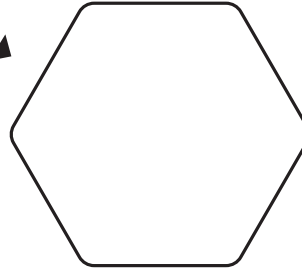
Bee Aware Month

Learn about honey

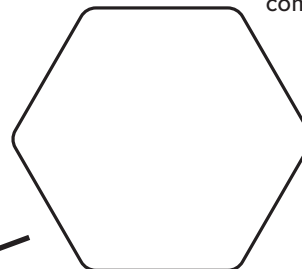
1. Bees suck nectar from flowers with their long tongues (proboscis).



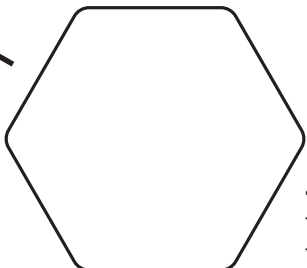
2. Bees carry nectar to their hive in their special honey stomach. Enzymes in their stomach change the nectar into honey.



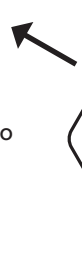
3. Bees store the honey in honey comb cells.



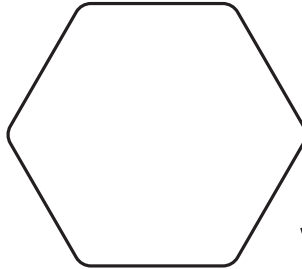
4. Bees fan their wings really fast to dry the moisture out of the honey.



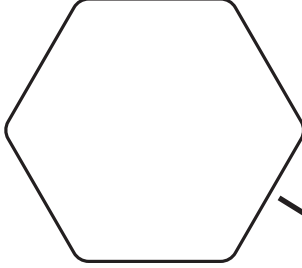
7. We eat it! Draw a picture here of a person eating honey!
