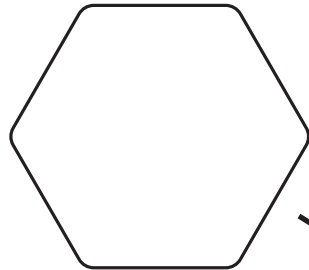


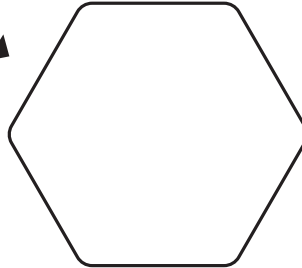
# Bee Aware Month

## Learn about honey

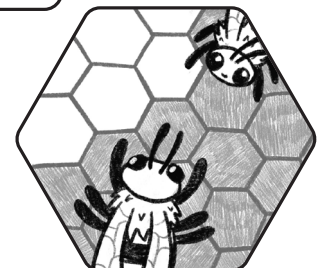
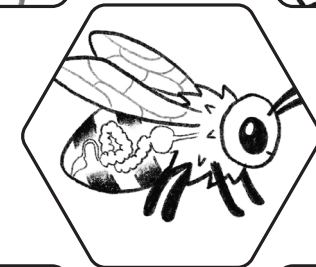
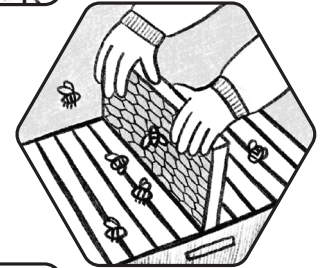
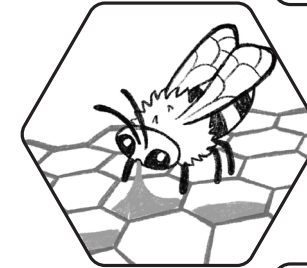
1. Bees suck nectar from flowers with their long tongues (proboscis).



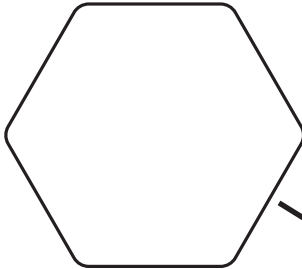
2. Bees carry nectar back to the hive in their special honey stomach.



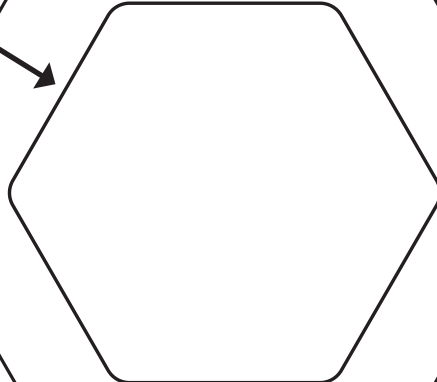
3. Bees pour nectar into the honey-comb cells.



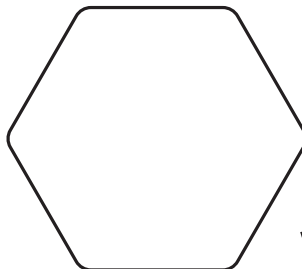
6. Beekeepers take the honey off the hive (but leave some for the bees!)



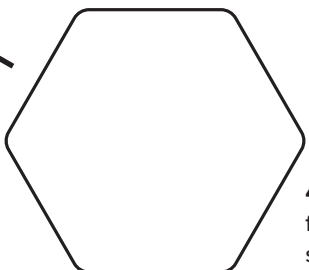
7. We eat it! Draw a picture here of a person eating honey!
